A. RISK FACTORS

Standard Risk Factors

- Investment in Mutual Fund Units involves investment risks such as trading volumes, settlement risk, liquidity risk, default risk including the possible loss of principal.
- As the price / value / interest rates of the securities in which the scheme invests fluctuate, the value of your investment in the scheme may go up or down. The value of investments may be affected, inter-alia, by changes in the market, interest rates, changes in credit rating, trading volumes, settlement periods and transfer procedures; the NAV is also exposed to Price/Interest-Rate Risk and Credit Risk and may be affected inter-alia, by government policy, volatility and liquidity in the money markets and pressure on the exchange rate of the rupee.
- Past performance of the Sponsor/AMC/Mutual Fund does not guarantee future performance of the scheme.
- Quantum Multi Asset Fund (QMAF) is the name of the Scheme. The name of the Scheme does not in any manner indicate either the quality of the scheme or its future prospects and the returns. Investors are therefore urged to study the terms of offer carefully and consult their Investment Advisor before they invest in the Scheme.
- The sponsor is not responsible or liable for any loss or shortfall resulting from the operation of the scheme beyond the initial contribution of Rs.1,00,000 made by it towards setting up the Fund.
- The present scheme is not a guaranteed or an assured return scheme.

Scheme Specific Risk Factors

1. The scheme will invest predominantly in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund. Hence all the risk associated with the underlying schemes, including performance of underlying of the underlying schemes, asset class risk, passive investment risk, indirect taxation risk (applicable on gold investments – Increase / decrease in duties / taxes like Customs duty, Octroi charges, Vat, etc.) etc., will therefore be applicable to this scheme. Any changes in the investment policy or the fundamental attributes of the underlying schemes could affect the performance of the Scheme. Investors who intend to invest in the Scheme are required to and deemed to have understood the risk factors of the underlying schemes.
2. The NAV's of the Scheme(s) may be affected by the changes in the general market conditions, factors and forces affecting the capital markets in particular, level of interest rates, various market related factors and trading volumes, settlement periods and transfer procedures, currency exchange rates, changes in the government policies, taxation laws, any other policies, political and economic developments etc.
3. Despite the fact that the underlying portfolio investments of the Scheme will typically be liquid, in the event of receipt of an inordinately large number of redemption requests and inability of the Underlying Scheme(s) to generate enough liquidity because of market conditions, there may be delays in redemption of units.
4. The liquidity of the Scheme's investments is inherently restricted by liquidity of Underlying Schemes.
5. Unitholders of the Scheme are not being offered any guarantee / assured returns.
6. Changes in government policy in general and in tax benefits applicable to mutual funds may impact the returns to investors in the Scheme.
7. The investor of the Scheme shall bear the recurring expenses, transaction charges and loads if any of the Scheme in addition to the expenses, transaction charges & loads of the underlying schemes. Hence the investor under the scheme may receive lower pre-tax returns than that they could have received if they had invested directly in the underlying schemes in the same proportions.
8. The portfolio disclosure of the Scheme will be limited to providing the particulars of the underlying schemes where the Scheme has invested and will not include the investments made by the underlying schemes.
9. The changes in asset allocation may result in higher transaction costs.

COMMON RISK ASSOCIATED WITH INVESTMENTS IN DEBT AND MONEY MARKET INSTRUMENTS

Given below are some of the common risks associated with investments in fixed income and money market securities. These risks include but are not restricted to:

(a) Liquidity and Settlement Risks

This refers to the ease at which a security can be sold at or near its true value. The primary measure of liquidity risk is the spread between the bid price and the offer price quoted by a dealer. Liquidity risk is characteristic of the Indian fixed income market. The liquidity of the Scheme's investments may be inherently restricted by trading volumes, transfer procedures and settlement periods. From time to time, the Scheme will invest in certain debt securities of certain companies, industries, sectors, etc. based on its investment objectives and policies as outlined in this Scheme Offer Document. Reduced liquidity in the secondary market may have an adverse impact on market price and the Scheme's ability to dispose of particular securities, when necessary, to meet the Scheme's liquidity needs or in response to a specific economic event or during restructuring of the Scheme's investment portfolio.

(b) Investment Risks

The value of, and income from, an investment in the Scheme can decrease as well as increase, depending on a variety of factors which may affect the values and income generated by the Scheme's portfolio of debt securities. The returns of the Scheme's investments are based on the current yields of the securities, which may be affected generally by factors affecting capital markets such as price and volume, volatility in the stock markets, interest rates, currency exchange rates, foreign investment, changes in Government and Reserve Bank of India policy, taxation, political, economic or other developments, closure of the Stock Exchanges etc. Different types of securities in which the Scheme would invest as stated in the Scheme Offer Document carry different levels and types of risk. Accordingly the Scheme's risk may increase or decrease depending upon its investment pattern. e.g. corporate bonds carry a higher amount of risk than Government securities. Further even amongst corporate bonds, bonds which are AAA rated are comparatively less risky than bonds which are AA rated. The Scheme will endeavour to invest in highly rated securities offering relative yield for the commensurate risks. However the erosion in the value of the investments/portfolio in the case of the capital and financial markets passing through a bearish phase is a distinct possibility.

(c) Interest Rate Risk

Changes in interest rate may affect the Scheme's net asset value. Generally the prices of instruments increase as interest rates decline and decrease as interest rates rise. Prices of long-term securities fluctuate more in response to such interest rate changes than short-term securities. Indian debt and government securities markets can be volatile leading to the possibility of price movements up or down in fixed income securities and thereby to possible movements in the NAV.

(d) Credit Risk

Credit risk or Default risk refers to the risk that an issuer of a fixed income security may default (i.e. the issuer will be unable to make timely principal and interest payments on the security). Because of this risk, debentures are sold at a higher yield above those offered on Government Securities which are sovereign obligations and free of credit risk. Normally, the value of fixed income securities will fluctuate depending upon the changes in the perceived level of credit risk as well as any actual event of default. The greater the credit risk, the greater the yield required for someone to be compensated for the increased risk.

(e) Re-investment Risk

Investments in fixed income securities may carry re-investment risk as interest rates prevailing on the interest or maturity due dates may differ from the original coupon of the bond. Consequently, the proceeds may get invested at a lower rate. This risk refers to the interest rate levels at which cash flows received from the securities in the Scheme or from maturities in the Scheme are reinvested. The additional income from reinvestment is the "interest on interest" component. The risk refers to the fall in the rate for reinvestment of interim cash flows.

COMMON RISK ASSOCIATED WITH INVESTMENTS IN GOLD

(a) Price Risk:

Investors returns would be affected on account of movement in gold prices. The investor may lose money over short or long period due to fluctuation in gold prices in response to factors such as economic and political developments, change in interest rates, demand supply fundamentals and perceived trends in bullion prices, market movement and over longer periods during market downturns.

(b) Regulatory Risk:

Any changes in the regulations relating to import and export of gold (including customs duty, sales tax and any other statutory levies) may affect the gold prices and the ability to buy /sell gold.

Whereas the Indian Markets was formerly restrictive, a process of deregulation has been taking place over recent years. This process has involved removal of trade barriers and protectionist measures, which could adversely affect the value of investments. It is possible that the future changes in the Indian political situation, including political, social or economic instability, diplomatic developments and changes in tax laws, changes in SEBI / Stock Exchange / RBI regulations and other applicable laws / regulations could have an effect on such investments and valuation thereof. Expropriation, confiscatory taxation or other relevant developments could affect the value of investments.

(c) Custody Risk:

There is a risk that part or all the gold could be lost, damaged or stolen. Access of the underlying gold could also be restricted by natural events or human actions.

B. REQUIREMENT OF MINIMUM INVESTORS IN THE SCHEME

The Scheme/Plan shall have a minimum of 20 investors and no single investor shall account for more than 25% of the corpus of the Scheme/Plan(s). However, if such limit is breached during the NFO of the Scheme, the Fund will endeavor to ensure that within a period of three months or the end of the succeeding calendar quarter from the close of the NFO of the Scheme, whichever is earlier, the Scheme complies with these two conditions. In case the Scheme / Plan(s) does not have a minimum of 20 investors in the stipulated period, the provisions of Regulation 39(2)(c) of the SEBI (MF) Regulations would become applicable automatically without any reference from SEBI and accordingly the Scheme / Plan(s) shall be wound up and the units would be redeemed at applicable NAV. The two conditions mentioned above shall also be complied within each subsequent calendar quarter thereafter, on an average basis, as specified by SEBI. If there is a breach of the 25% limit by any investor over the quarter, a rebalancing period of one month would be allowed and thereafter the investor who is in breach of the rule shall be given 15 days' notice to redeem his exposure over the 25 % limit. Failure on the part of the said investor to redeem his exposure over the 25 % limit within the aforesaid 15 days would lead to automatic redemption by the Mutual Fund on the applicable Net Asset Value on the 15th day of the notice period. The Fund shall adhere to the requirements prescribed by SEBI from time to time in this regard.

C. SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Quantum Mutual Fund Profile:

Quantum Mutual Fund started its journey in 2006. With the investor as their primary focus, and the investor's benefit as their leading priority, Quantum Mutual Fund refused to adhere to the 'commission paying style' of promoting its funds. With this ideology in mind, Quantum Mutual Fund was established as India's 1st direct-to-investor mutual fund. Quantum is a Low Cost fund that brings its investors additional cost savings, by offering them one of the lowest Expense Ratios in the industry. Quantum Mutual Fund uses the online medium to reach to investors directly. With the launch of the industry's 1st completely paperless Invest Online section, Quantum is looking at newer ways to make investing simple and leverage the potential of the internet and the power of technology.

Considerations:

Quantum Asset Management Private Limited (AMC) has received the approvals / No Objections from SEBI to provide Research Services in Equities and Fixed Income, and Research / Advisory Services in Multi Asset Allocation and Emerging Markets in the Alternative Investment filed to Quantum Advisors Private Limited (Sponsor) and QIEF Management LLC (QIEF) on commercial basis.

The AMC is providing Research Service in Equities and Fixed Income to the Sponsor and QIEF and Research / Advisory Services in Multi Asset Allocation and Emerging Markets to Sponsor which is non-binding and non-discretionary in nature and not in conflict of interest with the activities of Quantum Mutual Fund. The AMC has process in place to prohibit access to inside information of various activities as envisaged under Regulation 24(b) of SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996 by segregating the Key Personnel, System and Back Office, Bank Account activity wise.

SEBI vide its Letter dated May 02, 2012, had advised the Fund to - Ensure that the scheme garners the minimum target amount of Rs. 10 Crores within one year from the launch of the Scheme i.e. on or before June 22, 2013. Further, SEBI vide its Letter dated June 17, 2013 have extended the said period up to June 22, 2014. The Fund has garnered the minimum target amount of Rs. 10 Crore on June 18, 2014.

A. TYPE OF THE SCHEME

An Open ended Fund of Funds Scheme.

An open ended Fund of Funds scheme that invest across multiple asset classes predominantly in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund whose underlying investments are in equity, debt / money markets and Gold.

The Scheme may invest in the units of debt / money market schemes of other mutual funds to gain exposure to debt as an asset class to manage any investment and regulatory constraints that arise / that prevent the Scheme from increasing investments in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

B. WHAT IS THE INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE OF THE SCHEME?

The investment objective of the Scheme is to generate modest capital appreciation while trying to reduce risk (by diversifying risks across asset classes) from a combined portfolio of equity, debt / money markets and Gold schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

The Scheme may invest in the units of debt / money market schemes of other mutual funds to gain exposure to debt as an asset class to manage any investment and regulatory constraints that arise / that prevent the Scheme from increasing investments in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

There can be no assurance that the investment objective of the Scheme will be realized.

C. HOW WILL THE SCHEME ALLOCATE ITS ASSETS?

The asset allocation under the Scheme, under normal circumstances, will be as follows:

The Scheme will predominantly invest in the units of Equity, Debt/ Money Markets and Gold schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund. Units of any other Equity and Debt schemes launched by Quantum Mutual Fund from time to time would be eligible to be part of the above asset allocation.

Currently, the Scheme is not allowed to invest in the units of Fund of Funds Scheme as per the SEBI Regulations. The Scheme will invest in units of the Fund of Funds Schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund as and when permitted under the SEBI Regulations.

The Scheme will invest in money market instruments, Short term corporate debt securities, CBLO, CBLO Repo / Reverse Repo in government securities and treasury bills only as per the prevailing regulations from time to time, only for the purpose of liquidity requirements.

The Scheme may invest in the units of debt / money market schemes of other mutual funds to gain exposure to debt as an asset class to manage any investment and regulatory constraints that arise / that prevent the Scheme from increasing investments in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

The portfolio is reviewed periodically to address any deviations from the aforementioned allocations due to market changes.

The above asset allocation is only indicative and may change from time to time, keeping in view the market conditions and applicable rules and regulations.

Change in Investment Pattern

Subject to SEBI Regulations, the asset allocation pattern indicated above may change from time to time keeping in view applicable regulations and political and economic factors. It must be clearly understood that the percentage stated above are only indicative and not absolute. These proportions may vary substantially depending upon the perception of the AMC, the intention being all the times to seek to protect the interest of the unit holders.

Such changes in the asset allocation may be for short term and defensive considerations. In the event of deviations, the Fund Manager will endeavor to carry out rebalancing within 30 Business Days, justification for the same shall be placed before the Key Employee Investment Committee and reasons for the same shall be recorded in writing. The Key Employee Investment Committee shall then decide on the course of actions. However, at all the times the portfolio will adhere to the overall investment objectives of the Scheme.

D.WHERE WILL THE SCHEME INVEST?

The Scheme will predominantly invest in the units of the Equity, Debt / Money Markets and Gold Schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

The following schemes would be used for gaining exposure to particular asset class:

Equity – Quantum Long Term Equity Fund, Quantum Index Fund (ETF)
Debt/ Money Market – Quantum Liquid Fund, Quantum Dynamic Bond Fund
Gold – Quantum Gold Fund (ETF)

The Units of any other Equity and Debt / Money Markets scheme launched by Quantum Mutual Fund from time to time would be eligible to be part of the above asset allocation components. Existing Fund of Funds offerings launched by Quantum are currently not permitted for investments in the Scheme. However, as and when permitted by regulations, the same would be considered for allocations under respective asset class and be part of the asset allocation components mentioned under para Asset Allocation.

Although the Scheme aims to invest predominately only in the schemes launched by Quantum Mutual Fund, the Scheme may seek to invest in the units of similar schemes of other mutual fund houses in case of any investment and regulatory constraints that arise that prevent the Scheme from increasing investments in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund. This will be applicable to only the debt / money markets schemes that the Scheme invests in to gain exposure to debt as an asset class.

The investments in the units of the underlying Schemes will be made directly with the underlying Schemes and / or through the secondary market. The Scheme will allocate investments dynamically between the units of equity, debt/money markets and Gold schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

The Scheme will invest in money market instruments, short term Corporate debt securities, CBLO and Repo / Reverse Repo in government securities and treasury bills only as per the prevailing regulations from time to time, only for the purpose of liquidity requirements. The portfolio is reviewed periodically to address any deviations from the aforementioned allocations due to market changes.

Pending deployments of funds of the scheme in securities in terms of investment objectives of the Scheme, the AMC can invest the funds of the scheme in short-term deposits of scheduled commercial banks in accordance with SEBI Guidelines.

E.WHAT ARE THE INVESTMENT STRATEGIES?

Portfolio allocation between the units of equity, debt/ money markets and gold schemes broadly depends on the relative valuations between the asset classes. Relative valuations are determined by evaluation of various influencing factors. Some of the factors that would be reviewed thoroughly for determination of allocations across asset classes include:

- Price/Earnings Ratio relative to historical averages;
- The relationship between Earnings Yield to Bond Yield relative to historical averages;
- Macroeconomic factors prevailing globally, and within India.

The most well-known valuation parameter for equity is the Price-Earnings (P/E) ratio. The estimated earnings of a company are valued at varying multiples that result in a specific but constantly changing price. The P/E multiple is used to determine the current valuation of a stock. Typically, when the P/E ratio exceeds its historical or expected levels the stock moves to an overvalued price. As the P/E ratios of stocks increase over their historical or expected averages, the scheme will look to progressively reduce exposure to equities.

The inverse of P/E ratio is earnings yield: it is the earnings per share of the company, divided by the price per share typically expressed as a percentage. This earnings yield can be compared to the bond yield for assessing the relative over or under-valuation of stocks with respect to bonds. Earnings yields on stocks should offer investors a premium over bond yields due to the relatively higher risk associated with investing in equity – ownership of bonds give defined coupon payments, while ownership of shares does not guarantee any payments. This is referred to as the equity risk premium. When the equity risk premium falls to levels below historical averages, equities become relatively more expensive over bonds. These relative yields between bonds and stocks will provide key input to the allocation between equity and debt / money market schemes.

Gold has historically acted as an effective portfolio diversifier. It generally tends to have a negative correlation to equities. Based on the above notion, allocation to gold would therefore increase at times when equities appear expensive on a relative basis and decrease at times when equities appear relatively undervalued.

In addition to these market related factors, the macro environment could influence the allocation decisions. The Portfolio/ Investment Team will need to assess RBI monetary policy, various global and domestic lead/ lag economic indicators, inflation trends, foreign central bank policies and evaluate their impact as the Portfolio/ Investment Team determine the asset allocation between equity/ debt / money markets / gold schemes.

After analyzing some or all the factors mentioned above, the Portfolio/ Investment Team determines the relative allocation to specific equity, debt / money markets and gold schemes. The allocations would be regularly reviewed and necessary portfolio changes would be carried out based on the analysis suggested by various influencing factors.

RISK CONTROL / RISK MANAGEMENT STRATEGY

Risk is an important part of investment function. Effective risk management is critical to fund management for achieving financial goals. Investment made by the Scheme shall be made in accordance with investment objective of the Scheme and provisions of SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996.

The Fund has identified following risks and designed risk management strategy which is the part of the investment process to manage such risks.

RECORDING OF INVESTMENT DECISIONS

The Investment Decisions will be made by the AMC's Portfolio/ Investment Team. The Portfolio / Investment Team will comprise of the Fund Manager and Associate Fund Manager. The Investment decisions of the Scheme will be carried out by the Portfolio/ Investment Team.

The Chief Executive Officer is not involved in the investment decision making process.

Record of all investment decisions will be maintained with justifications for the same as required under the regulations.

It is the responsibility of the AMC to ensure that the investments are made as per the internal / Regulatory guidelines, Scheme's investment objective and in the best interest of the Unit holders of the Scheme.

All investment decisions shall be recorded in terms of SEBI Circular no MFD/CIR/6/73/2000 dated July 27, 2000 or as may be revised by SEBI from time to time.

PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT AND REPORTING

The Key Employee Investment Committee of the AMC at its regular meeting shall review performance of the Scheme, compliance of the various investment restrictions and compliance with the investment objectives stipulated in the Scheme Information Document and all other applicable SEBI Regulations. The AMC and Trustees shall also review the performance of the Scheme at their periodical Board Meetings. The performance would be compared with the performance of the Benchmark and with peer group in the industry.

The CEO/Fund Manager will make presentations to the Board of the AMC and the Trustee periodically, indicating the performance of the Scheme. The Board of AMC and Trustee will review the performance of the Scheme in comparison to the benchmark. The Trustees reserve the right to change the benchmark for evaluation of performance of the Scheme from time to time in conformity with the Investment objectives and appropriateness of the benchmark subject to SEBI Regulations, and other prevailing guidelines, if any.

The CEO/Fund Manager will bring to the notice of the AMC Board, specific factors if any, which are impacting the performance of the Scheme. The Board on consideration of all relevant factors may, if necessary, give appropriate directions to the AMC. Similarly, the performance of the Scheme will be submitted to the Trustees. The CEO/Fund Manager will explain to the Trustees, the details on the Schemes' performance vis-à-vis the benchmark returns. The Trustees and the AMC Board may also review the performance of the schemes in the light of performance of the mutual funds industry as published from time to time by independent research agencies and financial newspapers and journals and may take corrective action in case of unsatisfactory performance.

PORTFOLIO TURNOVER

The scheme is an open-ended scheme. It is therefore expected that there would be a number of subscriptions and redemption on a daily basis that may require purchase and sale of the units /securities. Therefore, it is difficult to estimate with any reasonable measure of accuracy, the likely turnover in the portfolio.

INVESTMENT BY AMC IN THE SCHEME

The AMC may invest in the Scheme at any time during the continuous offer period subject to the SEBI Regulations & circulars issued by SEBI and to the extent permitted by its Board of Directors from time to time. As per the existing SEBI Regulations, the AMC will not charge investment management and advisory fee on the investment made by it in the Scheme.

The investment objective of the Scheme is to generate modest capital appreciation while trying to reduce risk (by diversifying risks across asset classes) from a combined portfolio of equity, debt / money market and Gold schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund

The Scheme may invest in the units of debt / money market schemes of other mutual funds to gain exposure to debt as an asset class to manage any investment and regulatory constraints that arise / that prevent the Scheme from increasing investments in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

There can be no assurance that the investment objective of the Scheme will be realized.

b. Investment pattern –

The Scheme will predominantly invest in the units of Equity, Debt/ money markets and Gold schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

The Scheme may invest in the units of debt / money market schemes of other mutual funds to gain exposure to debt as an asset class to manage any investment and regulatory constraints that arise / that prevent the Scheme from increasing investments in the schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund.

Portfolio break-up with minimum and maximum asset allocation is mentioned under paragraph 'Asset Allocation'.

(iii) Terms of Issue

(a) Liquidity provisions such as listing, repurchase, redemption.

The Scheme is open ended Fund of Funds scheme with Purchase and Redemption of Units on any Business Day. The Units are not proposed to be listed on any stock exchange. The procedure for repurchase/Redemption is as set out in the repurchase/Redemption of Units in Section III B of this SID.

(b) Aggregate fees and expenses charged to the scheme.

The aggregate fees and expenses charged to the Scheme are set out in Section IV, Paragraph B which is as permitted by the SEBI Regulations.

(c) The Scheme is not a guaranteed or assured return scheme and hence no safety net or guarantee is provided.

In accordance with Regulation 18(15A) of the Regulations, the Trustees shall ensure that no change in the fundamental attributes of the Scheme and the plan(s) / Option (s) or the trust or fee and expenses payable or any other change which would modify the Scheme(s) and affect the interests of Unit Holders is carried out unless:

- A written communication about the proposed change is sent to each Unit Holder and an advertisement is given in one English daily newspaper having nationwide circulation as well as in a newspaper published in the language of the region where the Head Office of the Mutual Fund is situated; and
- The Unit Holders are given an option for a period of 30 (thirty) days to exit at the prevailing NAV without any Exit Load.

G. HOW WILL THE SCHEME BENCHMARK ITS PERFORMANCE?

The Scheme's performance will be benchmarked against Crisil Composite Bond Fund Index (40%) + S&P BSE Sensex Total Return Index (40%) + Domestic price of Gold (20%). The Benchmark has been selected as the Scheme being Fund of Funds scheme predominantly investing in the units of Equity, Debt / Money Markets and Gold schemes of Quantum Mutual fund. Therefore, the aforesaid benchmark is most suited for comparing performance of the Scheme.

The Trustee reserves the right to change benchmark in future for measuring performance of the Scheme in conformity with investment objective of the Scheme subject to SEBI Regulations.

I. WHAT ARE THE INVESTMENT RESTRICTIONS?

INVESTMENT RESTRICTIONS

The following investment limitations and other restrictions, inter-alia, as contained in the Trust Deed and the Regulations apply to the Scheme:

1. The Scheme shall invest predominantly in units of Equity / debt / money market / gold schemes of Quantum Mutual Fund in accordance with the investment objective. However it will also invest in money market instruments / short term corporate debt securities / CBLO as per the prevailing regulations and except to the extent necessary to meet the liquidity requirements for repurchases or redemptions, and in the units of debt / money market schemes of other mutual funds as disclosed in this SID.
2. The Scheme shall buy and sell securities on the basis of deliveries and shall in all cases of purchases, take delivery of securities and in all cases of sale, deliver the securities and shall in no case put itself in a position whereby it has to make short sale or carry forward transaction
3. No loans for any purpose can be advanced by the Scheme.
4. The Fund shall not borrow except to meet temporary liquidity needs of the Fund for the purpose of Repurchase/ Redemption of Units or payment of interest and/or dividend to the Unitholders, provided that the Fund shall not borrow more than 20% of the net assets of the individual Scheme and the duration of the borrowing shall not exceed a period of 6 months or as may be permitted by the Regulation from time to time.
5. Pending deployment of funds of the Scheme in securities in terms of investment objectives of the Scheme, the AMC can invest the funds of the Scheme in short-term deposits of scheduled commercial banks. The investments in short term deposits of scheduled commercial banks will be reported to the trustees along with the reasons for the investment which, inter alia, would include comparison with the interest rates offered by other scheduled commercial banks. Further, the AMC will ensure that the reasons for such investments are recorded in the manner prescribed in SEBI Circular MFD/CIR/6/73/2000 dated July 27, 2000 and such investments in short term deposits are made in compliance of SEBI Circular SEBI/IMD/CIR No1/91171/07 dated April 16, 2007 and circular dated October 26, 2007 or such other guidelines that SEBI may issue from time to time.
6. The Scheme shall not make any investment in a Fund of Funds Scheme as currently it is not allowed under the Regulations. The Scheme will invest in the Fund of Funds Scheme of Quantum Mutual Fund as and when it will be allowed under the Regulations.
7. The Scheme shall not invest in ADR/GDR, foreign securities, derivative instruments and securitized debt and shall not lend securities. The Scheme shall not invest in repo / reverse repo in corporate debt securities. However, underlying schemes may have ADR/GDR, foreign securities, derivative instruments, repo / reverse repo in corporate debt securities and securitized debt in their investment strategies.
8. The Scheme shall not invest more than 10% of its NAV in debt instruments comprising money market instruments and non-money market instruments issued by a single issuer which are rated not below investment grade by a credit rating agency authorised to carry out such activity under the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 and this limit may be extended to 12% of the NAV of the Scheme subject to prior approval of the Board of the AMC and the Trustee. Provided that such limit shall not be applicable for investment in Government Securities, treasury bills and collateralized borrowing and lending obligations. Provided further that investments within such limits can be made in mortgage backed securitized debts which are rated not below investment grade by a credit rating agency registered with SEBI.
9. The Scheme shall not invest more than 10% of its NAV in unrated debt instruments issued by a single issuer and the total investment in such instruments shall not exceed 25% of the NAV of the Scheme. All such investments shall be made with the prior approval of the Board of Trustees and Asset Management Company.

10. The Scheme will comply with SEBI regulations and any other Regulations applicable to the investments of Mutual Funds from time to time. The Trustees may alter the above restrictions from time to time to the extent that changes in the Regulations may allow and/or as deemed fit in the general interest of the Unitholders.

Modifications, if any, in the Investment Restrictions on account of amendments to the Regulations shall supersede/override the provisions of the Trust Deed.

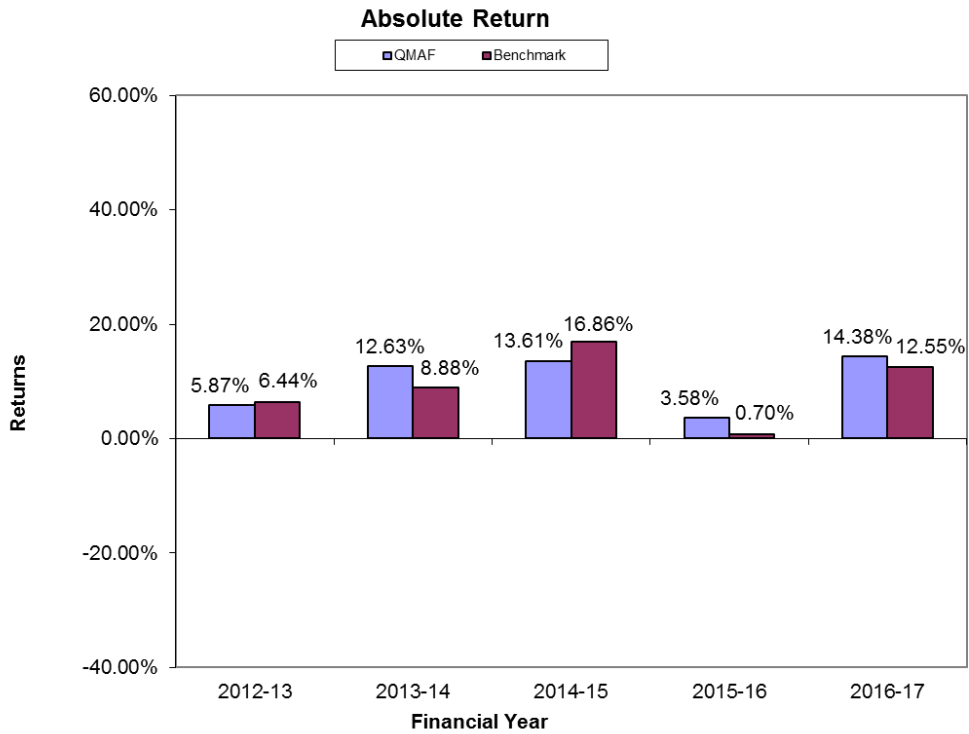

^ Investor Education and Awareness initiatives

As per Para F of the SEBI Circular No. CIR/IMD/DF/21/2012 dated September 13, 2012, the AMC shall annually set apart at least 2 basis points p.a. (i.e. 0.02% p.a.) on daily net assets of the Scheme within the limits of total expenses prescribed under Regulation 52 of SEBI (MF) Regulations for investor education and awareness initiatives undertaken by the Fund.

Regular Plan expense ratio will be higher of upto 0.15% plus Statutory Levies and Applicable Taxes (if any) in comparison of Direct Plan, wherein distributor commission for distribution of units will be paid / charged under the Regular Plan.

The AMC has estimated that above expenses will be charged to the Scheme as permitted under Regulation 52 of SEBI (MF) regulations. For the actual current expenses being charged, the investor should refer to the website of the Mutual Fund viz. www.QuantumAMC.com / www.QuantumMF.com

As per Regulation 52(6)(a) of SEBI (MF) Regulations, the total expenses of the Scheme, including weighted average of charges levied by the underlying schemes shall not exceed 2.50% of the daily net assets of the scheme.

Investment Management and Advisory Fees:

The Investment Management and Advisory fees charged by the AMC to scheme will be within / equal to the Total Expense Ratio Limit as prescribed by SEBI (MF) Regulations, as amended from time to time, with no sub-limit on the Investment Management and Advisory fees.

The AMC has estimated that up to 0.50% of the daily net assets of the Scheme will be charged to the Scheme as recurring expenses, as the NAV of the scheme is calculated on daily basis.

No management fees will be charged to the Scheme except if the Scheme invests in the schemes of fund house other than that of Quantum Mutual Fund. In such case the management fees will be charged to (that portion of the assets) the Scheme which will not be more than 0.25% of the daily (that portion of the assets) net assets of the Scheme subject to overall limit of 0.50% of the daily net assets of the Scheme.

Additional Expenses:

In addition to the Maximum Total Expense Ratio as permissible under Regulation 52 of SEBI MF Regulations as amended from time to time, following additional expenses may be charged to the Scheme as mentioned in below.

- a. Expenses not exceeding of 0.30 % of daily net assets if the new inflow from such cities as specified by the SEBI from time to time are at least 30 per cent of gross new inflows in the scheme or 15 per cent of the average assets under management (year to date) of the scheme whichever is higher.
- b. Expenses incurred towards different heads mentioned under sub-regulations 52 (2) i.e. Investment Management and Advisory Fees and 52 (4) i.e. recurring expense, not exceeding 0.20 per cent of daily net assets of to the scheme.
- c. Service Tax on investment and advisory fees of the Scheme.

Investors are requested to note that currently Quantum Mutual Fund shall not charge any additional expenses to the Scheme(s) as mentioned in the sub - clause (a) (b) and (c) above.

Service Tax and Statutory Levies on Investment Advisory fees will be charged to scheme within the overall limit of expense as permitted under the SEBI Regulations.

- d. Brokerage and transaction costs which are incurred for the purpose of execution of trade and is included in the cost of investment, not exceeding 0.12 % for cash market transactions.

As no additional expenses will be charged to the Scheme, the provisions relating to clawed back as prescribed in the SEBI (MF) Regulations will not be applicable.

The investor may note that, the investor of the Scheme shall bear the recurring expenses of the Scheme as stated above in addition to the expenses of the underlying schemes.

C. LOAD STRUCTURE

Load is an amount which is paid by the investor to subscribe to the units or to redeem the units from the scheme. Load amounts are variable and are subject to change from time to time.
